

## GRAND BAROSSA CHARDONNAY 2018

### Heritage

Château Tanunda was established in 1890 and is the site of some of the very first vines planted in the Barossa in the 1840s as well as the Valley's first winery. The Château is an Australian heritage icon whose grand buildings, magnificent gardens and prime vineyards are owned by the Geber family who continue a tradition of fine winemaking spanning three centuries.

### Vineyard

For our Grand Barossa Chardonnay we select grapes grown throughout the Barossa and it is this tapestry of 'terroirs' which enables us to create our classic and refined house style.

### Winemaking

Our house style is classic and refined, combining both traditional and modern winemaking techniques to make superb handcrafted wines of complexity and intensity.

### Tasting note

Heady aromas of citrus fruits, melon and white peach lead to bright tropical fruit flavours on the palate with a refreshing acidity. On the finish there is a hint of vanilla and cashew nut from partial new French oak barrel maturation. Grand Barossa Chardonnay displays all the delicacy, elegance and finesse that can be achieved from this noble variety.

### 92 Points – Sam Kim (Wine Orbit)

Beautifully ripe and inviting, the bouquet shows ripe peach, rockmelon and vibrant citrus characters with subtle notes of vanilla and cedar. It is succulent, rounded and flavoursome on the palate with lovely mid-palate weight and roundness, finishing long and comforting. At its best: now to 2023.
