

# GRAND BAROSSA CHARDONNAY 2019

# Heritage

Château Tanunda was established in 1890 and is the site of some of the very first vines planted in the Barossa in the 1840s as well as the Valley's first winery. The Château is an Australian heritage icon whose grand buildings, magnificent gardens and prime vineyards are owned by the Geber family who continue a tradition of fine winemaking spanning three centuries.

#### Vineyard

From a selection of vineyards across the Barossa, the grapes are picked at optimal ripeness in the cool of night to preserve freshness and retain optimal acidity.

#### Winemaking

Our house style is classic and refined, combining both traditional and modern winemaking techniques to make superb handcrafted wines of complexity and intensity.

## **Tasting note**

Exciting aromas of citrus fruits, melon and white peach lead to bright tropical fruit flavours on the palate with a refreshing acidity. On the finish there is a hint of vanilla and cashew nut from partial new French oak barrel maturation. Grand Barossa Chardonnay displays all the delicacy, elegance and finesse that can be achieved from this noble variety.

## 92 POINTS - Sam Kim, Wine Orbit

A beautifully styled chardonnay; the inviting bouquet shows apricot, baked fig and citrus peel characters with nuances of hazelnut and nougat. It's succulent and plump on the palate, offering lovely ripe fruit intensity backed by creamy mouthfeel and juicy acidity, making it immediately appealing. At its best: now to 2023.
