

## GRAND BAROSSA GRENACHE SHIRAZ MOURVÈDRE 2019

### Heritage

Château Tanunda, Icon of the Barossa was established in 1890 and is the site of some of the Valley's earliest vines as well as its first winery. The Château is privately owned by the Geber family who continue a tradition of fine wine making spanning three centuries.

### Vineyard

For our Grand Barossa wines, we select grapes grown throughout the Barossa and its myriad of sub-regions. It is this tapestry of 'terroirs' which enables us to create our classic and refined house style.

### Winemaking

Destemmed and fermented in separate parcels, the individual wine varieties were matured 18 months in new and seasoned French oak before the final blend was crafted prior to bottling.

### Tasting notes

This exciting blend of Grenache, Shiraz and Mourvèdre displays ripe aromas of blackberry, black cherry and raspberry flavours and accompanied by spicy, dark berry fruits and a hint of white pepper on the palate. The finish is long with fine grained tannins.

### 93 Points – Sam Kim (Wine Orbit)

Sweetly fruited and gorgeously comforting, the wine shows Black Doris plum, spiced cherry, vanilla, roasted nut and subtle game characters on the nose. The palate displays excellent weight and roundness, together with silky texture and supple tannins, offering terrific drinking. At its best: now to 2029
