# ‘The Old Cooperage’ Grenache 2017

### Heritage

The *Old Cooperage* celebrates the historic relationship between Chateau Tanunda and A.P. Johns Coopers. Since establishing the Chateau Tanunda Cooperage in 1889, four generations of the John family have worked in coopering in the Barossa and still provide barrels to our winery

### Vineyard

For this limited release wine, we selected a special parcel of Grenache from the Stonewell sub-region of the Barossa Valley.

### Winemaking

The wine is handcrafted in small open fermenters and basket pressed before 16 months’ maturation in French and American oak barrels.

### Notes and Reviews

Lifted aromas of cherry, raspberry, and liquorice are accompanied by spicy red berry fruits on the palate. The finish is long with fine-grained tannins from 14 months’ maturation in American and French oak barrels. 400 dozen produced. Enjoy now or cellar carefully for up to 7 years.

### 93 Points – Huon Hooke (The Real Review)

Medium to light brick-red colour, with a sweet toffee-apple and mellow autumnal leafy bouquet. The wine is rich and very fruit-sweet on the tongue, with alcohol warmth and viscosity, as well as big rich ripe fruit flavour, appropriately mellowed by wood ageing. A big, bouncy, joyful, hedonistic wine.
