# Terroirs of the Barossa 'Greenock' Shiraz 2016

## Heritage

Chateau Tanunda was established in 1890 and is the site of some of the first vines planted in the Barossa in the 1840s as well as the Valley's first winery. The Chateau is an Australian heritage icon whose grand buildings, magnificent gardens and prime vineyards are owned by the Geber family. In the Barossa, the family continue their own tradition of fine winemaking which spans over three centuries.

## Vineyard

The Terroirs of the Barossa looks to highlight the unique wine flavor characteristics within the individual sub-regions, or 'Parishes' in the Barossa. These differences stem from the relationships between man and place, with soils, climate zones, viticulture, aspects and water access, all playing important roles in the flavor of the grapes of these sites.

Greenock, the most westerly zone of the Barossa and also known as the Western Slopes, gives rise to some of the richest expressions of Shiraz from the Barossa.

Soil: Heavy brown earth, red clay and crackled ironstone

Altitude: 290m

## Winemaking

To ensure the unique character of this sub region is exemplified in the wine, small open fermenters and our basket press were employed to gently extract the wine.

Aging in the finest quality oak and selection of the truest barrels for 18 months has created a wine that respects and expresses its place of origin.

## Tasting

Rich plum, red cherry, liquorice, focused and linear. Dark chocolate notes with a long persistent finish.

Very deep purple/red colour with a dense, concentrated bouquet dominated by charred oak and rich ripe fruit. It's dominated by licorice and fruitcake on the palate. A very rich, super-ripe but also fresh and bright, full-bodied wine with masses of flavour and richness in a thoroughly opulent style. A most impressive wine! (From rich, red-brown clays at 300 metres altitude on the Barossa's Western Ridge). Drink 2020-2038
