



Terroirs of the Barossa 'Greenock' Shiraz 2018

Heritage

Château Tanunda was established in 1890 and is the site of some of the first vines planted in the Barossa in the 1840s as well as the Valley's first winery. The Château is an Australian heritage icon whose grand buildings, magnificent gardens and prime vineyards are owned by the Geber family. In the Barossa, the family continue their own tradition of fine winemaking which spans over three centuries.

Vineyard

The Terroirs of the Barossa looks to highlight the unique wine flavor characteristics within the individual sub-regions, or 'Parishes' in the Barossa. These differences stem from the relationships between man and place, with soils, climate zones, viticulture, aspects and water access, all playing important roles in the flavor of the grapes of these sites.

Greenock, the most westerly zone of the Barossa and also known as the Western Slopes, gives rise to some of the richest expressions of Shiraz from the Barossa.

Soil: Heavy brown earth, red clay and crackled ironstone

Altitude: 290m

Winemaking

To ensure the unique character of this sub region is exemplified in the wine, small open fermenters and our basket press were employed to gently extract the wine.

Aging in the finest quality oak and selection of the truest barrels for 18 months has created a wine that respects and expresses its place of origin.

Medium deep crimson. Intense elderberry, blackberry, praline aromas with espresso notes with lifted Barossa scrub notes. Inky textured animated wine with lovely ripe elderberry, blackberry fruits, mocha/ espresso notes, fine looseknit chalky/ grainy textures, a plummy core of fruit sweetness and a linear zip of pure underlying alcohol. Crunchy freshness at the finish. Beautifully balanced and classic.

Scents of red plums and cola-like spice dominate the nose of the 2018 Terroirs of the Barossa Greenock Shiraz. Matured just like the other wines in the Terroirs of the Barossa series, in a mix of French and American oak, the fruit shines brighter here, pushing hints of cedar and vanilla into the background. Full-bodied and expansive on the palate, the tannins are supple and practically creamy in nature, subtly supporting the fruit on the mid-palate and only emerging on the finish as a fine, softly dusty textural element that complements the long, mouthwatering finish.
