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## THE CHÂTEAU SINGLE VINEYARD EDEN VALLEY CABERNET SAUVIGNON 2016

### Heritage

Château Tanunda was established in 1890 and is the site of some of the first vines planted in the Barossa in the 1840s as well as the Valley's first winery. The *Château* is privately owned by the Geber family who continue a tradition of fine winemaking spanning three centuries.

### Vineyard

The grapes for this Cabernet Sauvignon are from select rows of our Eden Valley vineyard. The vines grow in the fertile mineral red clay soils enjoying extended ripening time thanks to the cooler climate at 400m altitude.

### Winemaking

The grapes are destemmed, but not crushed, and spend seven days fermenting in a small open stainless steel fermenters. We gently hand plunge and pump over the must several times per day for a gentle extraction of aromas, colour and tannins from the grapes. The wine is then gently basket-pressed before maturation for 18 months in combination of new and seasoned French oak barrels. Bottled unfiltered.

### Tasting note

This wine displays deep, rich purple and red hues. The bouquet has lifted aromas of blackcurrant, blueberry and spice on the silky smooth palate with hints of cedar and mint.
