

ICON OF THE BAROSSA

'100 Year Old Vines' Shiraz 2017

Heritage

Château Tanunda was established in 1890 and is the site of some of the first vines planted in the Barossa in the 1840s as well as the Valley's first winery. The 'Old Vines' series is all about showcasing the significant history and special wine characteristics and of a selection of old vine vineyards for which the Barossa valley is world famous.

Vineyard

The Barossa is home to some of the world's oldest ungrafted Shiraz vines and the grapes for this wine come from just two small vineyards in the Vine Vale and Nuriootpa sub-regions of the Barossa. The low-yielding '*Centenarian*' vines, noted for their intensity of flavor, were planted more than a century ago around the time construction of the Château itself began.

Winemaking

The grapes are destemmed, but not crushed, and spent seven days in a small, open fermenters. We gently hand plunge the must four times per day for a gentle extraction of aromas, colour and tannins. Upon completion of fermentation, the wine is gently basket-pressed and allowed to naturally complete malolactic fermentation in a combination of French and American oak barrels (20% New) before 24 months maturation in our cellars. Bottled unfiltered.

Intense, almost opaque, deep red colour. The nose has sweet oak spice with blood plums underneath. Big rich palate, syrup and velvet textures. Certainly shows serious intent in fruit ripeness and weight, without going beyond into stewed territory. Oak characters drive the savoury elements, hints of iodine and seashell give some light. Very long and driven. Overall everything holds together remarkably and would reward long-term cellaring. Drink 2025–2035

Medium deep crimson. Fragrant dark cherry, mulberry, blackberry aromas with vanilla, roasted almond, chinotto notes. Concentrated dark cherry, mulberry, blackberry pastille fruits, vanilla marzipan notes, fine looseknit chocolaty textures and integrated fresh mineral acidity. Finishes chalky firm with plentiful sweet fruit, spicy notes. A classic Barossa old vine Shiraz with superb density, richness of flavour and attack. Drink 2024 – 2032
