

## GRAND BAROSSA SHIRAZ 2022

### Heritage

Chateau Tanunda, Icon of the Barossa, was established in 1890 and is the site of some of the Valley's earliest vines as well as its first winery. The Geber family proudly continue a tradition of fine winemaking spanning three centuries.

### Vineyard

For our Grand Barossa Shiraz we select grapes grown throughout the Barossa and its myriad subregions. It is this tapestry of "terroirs" which enables us to create our classic and refined style

### Winemaking

By combining traditional and modern winemaking techniques, we make handcrafted wines of complexity, depth and intensity. Fermentation takes place in our Basket Press winery where the wine spends seven days on skins to extract flavour, tannin, and colour.

After gentle pressing, the wine is matured for 18 months in a combination of new and seasoned French & American oak barrels.

### Tasting notes

Lifted aromas of blackberry, plum and black pepper are accompanied by spicy, dark berry fruits on the palate. Although drinking well now this wine may be cellared for up to ten years from vintage.
