

GRAND BAROSSA SHIRAZ 2023 Year of the Snake Limited Edition

Overview

We will be celebrating the lunar calendar of THE YEAR OF THE SNAKE symbolising intelligence, intuition, wisdom, and creativity.

Heritage

Château Tanunda, Icon of the Barossa, was established in 1890 and is the site of some of the Valley's earliest vines as well as its first winery. The Geber family proudly continue a tradition of fine winemaking spanning three centuries.

Vineyard

For our Grand Barossa Shiraz we select grapes grown throughout the Barossa and its esteemed vineyards. It is this tapestry of "terroirs" which enables us to create our classic and refined style.

Winemaking

It has been handcrafted in small open fermenters and basket pressed before 18 months maturation in French and American oak barrels. By combining both traditional and modern wine making techniques, Château Tanunda is able to produce wines of complexity, depth and intensity.

Tasting note

Lifted aromas of blackberry, plum and black pepper are accompanied by spicy, dark berry fruits on the palate. The finish is long with fine-grained tannins from 18 months maturation in a combination of new and seasoned American and French oak barrel.
