Heritage

Château Tanunda, Icon of the Barossa, is one of Australia's most historically significant wineries. Established in 1890, the Château is a cornerstone of the Barossa wine industry and is the site of the Valley's first winery, as well as its first vineyards planted back in 1843.

The Geber family are custodians of a proud winemaking tradition spanning three centuries.

Winemaking

Made in the classical provençal style, this Rosé is made by pressing and fermenting the grapes as if creating a white wine. This meticulous approach ensures a delicate salmon hue, preserves exceptional fruit quality, and limits bitterness from tannins in the skins and seeds.

Tasting note

displays aromas bursting with juicy strawberry and raspberry leading to a lively palate full of red berry fruits and a cranberry lift on a crisp dry finish.
