



GRAND BAROSSA SHIRAZ 2024

Heritage

Château Tanunda was established in 1890 and is the site of some of the very first vines planted in the Barossa in the 1840s as well as the Valley's first winery. The Geber family proudly continue a tradition of fine winemaking spanning three centuries.

Vineyard

For our Grand Barossa wines, we select grapes grown throughout the Barossa and its myriad of sub-regions. It is this tapestry of 'terroirs' which enables us to create our classic and refined house style.

Winemaking

The grapes are fermented in small batches to retain their sub-regional characters. After destemming, the Shiraz ferments for 7 days on skins in open fermenters and is hand plunged twice daily. This encourages maximum extraction yet retains the dense, spicy fruit flavours that Shiraz is renowned for. The wine is gently pressed before maturing for up to 15 months in a combination of new and seasoned French and American oak barrels in our cellars.

Tasting note

Lifted aromas of blackberry, plum and black pepper are accompanied by spicy, dark berry fruits on the palate. Although drinking well now this wine may be cellared for up to ten years from vintage.
